So just think before you put down, think before you judge. **It lurks in all our bones.**

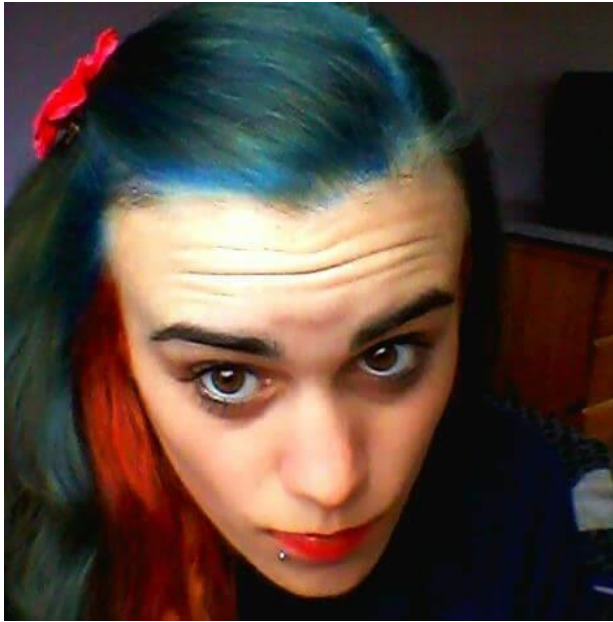
Whether you have a mental health problem or not, if a heart is still beating then they are still alive and every beating heart deserves equality.
